Putting In and Taking Out Colored Eye Contacts

How to Put In Colored Contacts

- 3. **Pinch the Lens:** Gently pinch the lens between your thumb and index finger and remove it from your eye.
- 4. Clean and Store: Clean the lens with contact lens solution and store it in its case.

Regular Check-Ups

Visit an eye doctor regularly to make sure your eyes are healthy and your contacts fit well. This helps prevent any problems and keeps your eyes in good shape.

Pay Attention to Your Eyes






